A health official in Rajasthan's Jalore district said on Thursday that seventy-four people became unwell after eating a wedding dinner.

On Wednesday, the incident occurred in Suraj Wada village, which is a part of the Raniwada police station area. They started getting sick after eating a meal at a wedding. The individuals were taken to the hospital after they started vomiting.

After receiving care, the patients were released from the hospital on Thursday, news agency PTI reported.

According to Gajendra Singh Deol, chief medical and health officer for Jalore, most of the victims who were ill were youths between the ages of 10 and 20.

He said that seven food samples, including vegetables, pulses, and sweets, had been sent for testing by the department. According to the police, no complaint has been filed in this matter.

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Meanwhile, in another incident, 97 children suffered from food poisoning after eating 'pani puri' at a local fair in Madhya Pradesh's Mandla district.

Dr K R Shakya, a civil surgeon in the district hospital said that the children complained of vomiting and stomach pain at around 7:30 pm and they were taken to the hospital.

Dr K R Shakya also said that 97 children were treated at the hospital and all of them are out of danger now.

A police official said that the snack seller was detained and food samples from his stall were sent for testing.

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
